

Family Medicine at PRHC

Nature of Services Provided

The members of the Department of Family Medicine provide a wide range of services within both the hospital and the community. They have the opportunity to practice in various care models, including independent physician practice, co-managed care with specialists, and collaboration with hospitalists. Crossing several programs within Peterborough Regional Health Centre (PRHC), family practitioners are involved in the following areas:

- Rehabilitation
- Complex Continuing Care
- Obstetrics
- Functional Enhancement Unit (Sub Acute)
- Emergency Medicine
- Palliative Care
- MRP for their own admitted Medical Patients
- Hospitalist Service
- Surgical Assistants

Rehabilitation

Family physicians are part of the multidisciplinary inpatient rehabilitation team who support patients requiring inpatient treatment for up to 60 days and serves adult patients who are recovering from stroke, neurological disorders (Guillain Barre Syndrome, Multiple Sclerosis, Parkinson's Disease, Peripheral Neuropathy), amputation, orthopedic surgery or trauma or general disability (e.g. post-operative strengthening). This includes regular stream and slow stream rehabilitation through Geriatric Assessment Treatment Unit (GATU).

Complex Continuing Care

The Complex Continuing Care (CCC) program at PRHC meets the highly specialized needs of adults with complex physical and/or cognitive conditions whose needs cannot be met at home or in the community. Family physicians are part of the multidisciplinary healthcare team that patients may see. The goal of the CCC program is to meet the patient's physical, emotional and social needs and improve quality of life, with a focus on discharge to the community, with or without supports.

Obstetrics

There are family practitioners who have developed a group practice that is solely focused on obstetrics. They provide pre and post-natal care and maintain a dedicated call schedule for their patients.

Functional Enhancement Unit (Sub Acute)

Designed to maintain, support and enhance the function and independence of patients who are waiting long term care placement.

- Staffed by physician and nurse practitioner model of care with RN, RPN's and PSW's
- Interdisciplinary Team consists of; PT, OT, Rehab Assistants, Recreation, RD, SW, CCAC Case managers
- 32-36 Patients

Emergency Medicine

Join this collegial emergency medicine department staffed primarily by CCFP/CCFP-EM trained physicians. This high acuity and high-volume department is well supported by its multidisciplinary team and specialists and has 24 hour CT access. The group offers excellent educational opportunities like teaching rounds, monthly in-situ simulations, and a yearly conference.

Palliative Care

There are family practitioners who focus primarily on in and outpatient palliative care. They provide MRP care for patients on a dedicated 22-bed unit at the hospital as well as maintaining a dedicated call schedule and providing pain and symptom management clinics to improve the end of life care and transitions.

MRP for Own Patients

The model allows family physicians admitting privileges for patients they carry in their community-based practice. These patients may be admitted and followed on an inpatient basis by the family physician acting as MRP throughout hospital stay.

Hospitalists

The model supports family physicians joining the Medicine Program as hospitalists. In this role, Hospitalists practice throughout the hospital and are responsible for the care of the majority of PRHC's inpatient population.

Physicians have the flexibility to pursue either a full-time hospitalist position or a hybrid model, combining part-time hospitalist work with a community-based family medicine practice, typically in collaboration with local Family Health Teams.

Surgical Assistants

There are a group of family practitioners who routinely fill the role of first assistant in the operating rooms assisting surgeons during their cases. Their commitments range from occasional work to full time. Some of them also provide availability for after-hours cases but they do not have a dedicated call group.
