- Operating room time, two (2) days per month

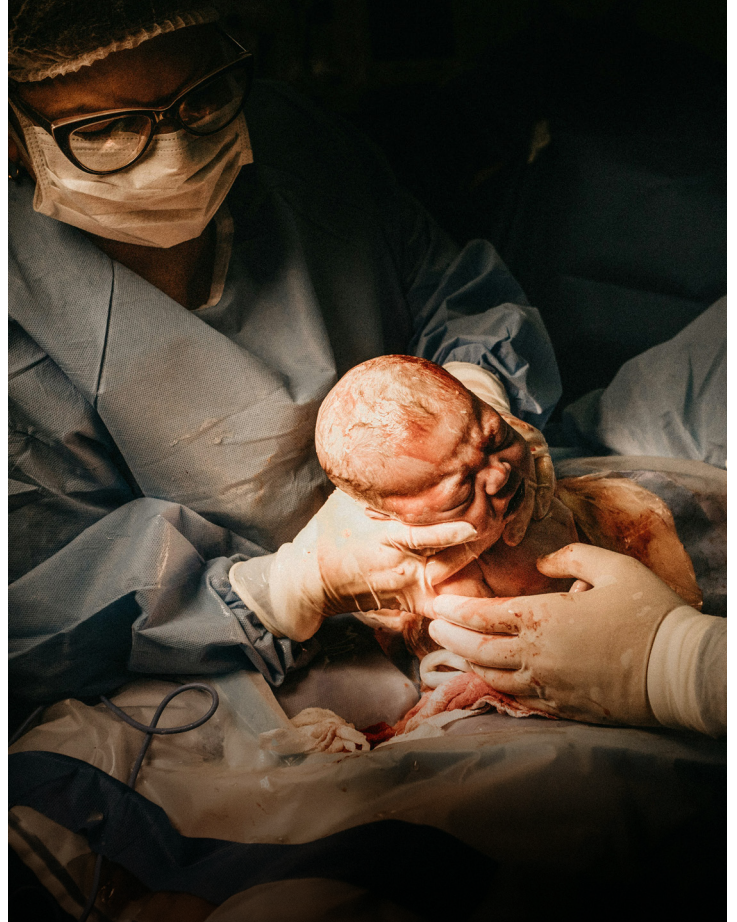
Options to assist colleagues in the operating room or to participate in abortion care are available.
